Maker Week 1: Cardboard Creativity

June 18 - 22

Explore a variety of hands-on crafts using predominantly cardboard materials. A culminating project will be short lessons with our design software, Rhinoceros, and a trip to the laser cutter in the Innovation Studio for a laser-cut model to take home. Specific projects will be tailored to students' interests.

Maker Week 2: Light it Up

Mrs. McNeil teaches basic circuits and LEDs using fun, handson projects such as squishy circuits, light-up badge, light-up mask, and more. Students who attend Maker 1 Cardboard Creativity can choose to add LED lights to their previously created projects. Arduino circuits hardware and software and online circuit building will also be explored in the camp. Optional: includes a take-home electronic circuit starter kit for an additional \$40.
